



In A-Level Biology you should....

After Each Lesson...

- Complete homework set during the lesson.
- Consolidate the content by reading through the lesson material, the relevant textbook pages and making your revision notes. (N.B. Notes should never be seen as complete and should be continuously added to from mark schemes and wider reading)
- File the lesson materials in the correct section of your folder.
- Prepare a list of questions to ask your teacher based on any misconceptions.

Every Week...

- Ensure you have the specification sheets and PowerPoints for the week's lessons printed
- Ensure your folder is organised as outlined on the student expectation sheet (see shared area)
- Push yourself to know more and remember more by completing:
 - the textbook summary questions
 - the Kerboodle retrieval quizzes
 - Seneca quizzes
 - making flash cards from the specification

Every Term...

- Complete some extracurricular reading to deepen your understanding of various biological concepts and give further context beyond the standard curriculum. In the extracurricular section on the shared area there is a reading list, and a list of suggested podcasts and YouTube channels.

Throughout the Year...

- Continually re-visit previously learned topics.
- Prepare thoroughly for the end of chapter tests by revising content and completing past paper questions (additional past paper questions arranged by topic can be found on the shared area)
