### After Each Lesson...

### Every Week...

- Create a revision resource to consolidate that topic/lesson.
- Create flashcards with key term/key sociologists/key ideas
- Plan/complete an exam question chose from the Tutor2 Study guide for each topic.
- Watch a Tutor2U topic video and makes notes
- Ensure MRIs are completed.
- Read the 'Interesting article of the week'

### Every Term...

- Complete end of topic test on SENECA, re-visit areas achieving below 90%.
- Identify area for revision and complete 30 mark/20 mark question on this topic.
- Make AO3 notes for each topic
- Make use of the wider reading in the library.
- Make use of JSTOR and find articles to deepen knowledge of topics.

### Throughout the Year...

- Revisit previously learned topics more than once.
