

# Sixth Form Admissions Policy Applications for September 2025

The Academy Trust of Bishop Stopford School is the Admissions Authority and is therefore responsible for all the admissions to the academy.

The Core Values of the school which relate specifically to this policy state that we are working together to form relationships based on:

- Faith everyone is invited to develop their understanding of Christian belief, worship and lifestyle.
- **Justice** everyone is entitled to be treated fairly and to promote the self-esteem of others.
- **Responsibility** everyone is expected to understand the consequences of their actions.
- Truth everyone is required to be honest and to communicate in a positive manner.
- **Compassion** everyone is encouraged to be generous in their concern for others.

Such values contribute to the academy's common purpose of 'Striving for high quality education with a strong Christian ethos.'

#### Introduction

The Bishop Stopford School post-16 offer is an A Level provision. A Levels are two-year programmes of study. These are academic courses, and therefore the entry requirements reflect the profile required to optimise chances of success for students.

Students' attainment at GCSE is measured in an 'Attainment 8' score and this guides the entry criteria for entry to Bishop Stopford School's Sixth Form (BSS6). (Appendix 1)

## **Admission Criteria (General Entry Requirement)**

Governors will automatically allocate places to:

- 1. Students from Bishop Stopford School who have *both* an Attainment 8 score of 50 or more, *and* a strong GCSE pass in English (grade 5 or above) and a standard GCSE pass in Maths (grade 4 or above). This is called the 'General Entry Requirement'. (Appendix 1)
- 2. Up to 75 students (the 'Stated Admission Number') from other schools who meet the same criteria as those for Bishop Stopford School at 1 above. (To ensure that the academy is in a position to offer 75 external places when results are known, more than 75 *conditional* places will be offered.)

## **Right to Appeal**

Students who do not achieve the General Entry Requirement have the right to appeal the decision not to award them a place. (Appendix 2)

## **Oversubscription Criteria for External Applicants**

Should there still be more than 75 external applicants who meet the entry criteria, they will be admitted in accordance with the following two priorities:

1. A looked after child or a child who was previously looked after, but immediately after being looked

after became subject to an adoption, residence, or special guardianship order. A looked after child is a child who is (a) in the care of a local authority, or (b) being provided with accommodation by a local authority in the exercise of their social services functions (see the definition in section 22(1) of the Children Act 1989).

2. Those who live nearest to the academy. North Northamptonshire County Council's GIS system will be used to determine the distance of the applicant's permanent home from the academy's Headlands entrance.

If there are places available on specific courses, the academy may consider admitting over the Stated Admission Number where an applicant is willing to follow courses which have spaces.

## **Late Applications**

All applications received after the deadline of January 31 in the year of admission will be deemed late, and put on a reserve list. Should a place/places become available once results are published in August, the Oversubscription Criteria above will be used to determine which applicant/s will be offered the vacant place/s.

#### **Admission to Courses**

In addition to the General Entry Requirement, some courses have individual entry requirements. These must be met for students to undertake that course. (Appendix 3)

## **Appendix One**

# **General Entry Requirement: Attainment 8 Explained**

Admissions to Bishop Stopford School Sixth Form will be measured by an 'Attainment 8' score. This comprises GCSEs in English and Mathematics, as well as the best 3 results from Ebacc subjects (sciences, computer science, geography, history and languages), and the 3 best other approved subjects.

## **Admission Criteria**

Automatic entry will be granted to students who have:

- An Attainment 8 score of 50 or more, and
- A GCSE pass in English at least grade 5 and in Maths a grade of at least a 4

Additional subject specific entry requirements must be met, where required.

# Appendix 3

# Course over- and under-subscription

Policy on Sixth Form Admissions September 2025

Planning for A level groups is a complex activity, because the number of students who will attend Bishop Stopford School in Year 12 is not known until the start of September. It is not unusual to receive applications from as many as 360 students, while in reality about 200 will actually take up their places. While we use our extensive experience to predict numbers in groups, it is not possible to ensure that those predictions will become reality. Our suite of over 20 subjects is provisionally on offer, but this offer only becomes certain when numbers in groups make such provision financially viable. Where there is undersubscription or over-subscription, students are required to follow reserve choices, this will be communicated clearly to all students affected after the enrolment period.

## **Under-subscription**

A Level courses are run dependent on viable numbers. Subjects attracting small numbers (i.e. fewer than 15 students) will be reviewed. Contact time may be reduced, Year 12 and Year 13 lessons timetabled concurrently or the subject withdrawn to ensure viability. While we offer over 20 subjects, not all combinations are possible. Subject combination information will be issued during induction in June.

## Over-subscription

Students who wish to study a subject which attracts, on average a class size of over 27 students, and where there is no capacity to put on a further group, will be asked to select a reserve choice. In addition, some subject combinations may not be possible, due to timetabling constraints, and students will then be asked to choose between two subjects and identify another choice.

Where oversubscription exists, the procedure for selecting students to follow a reserve choice course is as follows:

- 1. All students who have selected the option will be invited to take up their reserve choice if they have no strong preference.
- 2. If the number of students taking up their reserve choice removes oversubscription, no further students will be required to follow a reserve choice.
- 3. If however, numbers still need to be reduced, a process of random selection will take place. NB. EHCP and/or who were in receipt of Pupil Premium funding / disadvantaged, will have their places on the course concerned guaranteed.

The final decision regarding students' places on courses lies with the school. A waiting list for each course will be held until 1st October in line with our over-subscription criteria. Plans for Year 12 courses at Bishop Stopford School are provisional, dependent on group sizes and timetabling constraints. All rights to modify the provisional curriculum lie with the school.

Art	6 or above preferred in Art
Biology	6 or above in GCSE Biology and another single science, or two 6s or above in Combined Science and 6 or above in GCSE Maths
Business	5 or above in GCSE Business, if taken; 5 or above in GCSE Maths
Chemistry	6 or above in GCSE Chemistry and another single science, or two 6s or above in Combined Science and 6 or above in GCSE Maths
Computer Science	5 or above preferred in Computer Science, if taken; 5 or above in GCSE Maths
Design Technology (Product Design / Fashion & Textiles)	5 or above in GCSE Design & Technology
Economics	5 or above in GCSE Maths
English Language & Literature /English Literature	6 and 5 in both GCSE English courses in either order
French	6 or above GCSE French (Higher Tier)
Geography	5 or above in GCSE Geography, if taken
History	5 or above in GCSE History, if taken
Maths	7 or above in GCSE Maths
Further Maths	9 preferred in GCSE Maths (8 will be considered on an individual basis)
Music	6 or above in GCSE Music, and at least Grade 5 on main instrument
PE	5 or above in GCSE PE, if taken; plus a commitment to one sport or physical activity
Physics	6 or above in GCSE Physics and another single science, or two 6s or above in Combined Science and 6 or above in GCSE Maths
Politics	5 or above in a GCSE Humanities subject (including RE)
Psychology	5 or above in GCSE Biology and another single science, or two 5s in Combined Science and 5 or above in GCSE Maths
Religious Studies (Philosophy and Ethics)	5 or above in GCSE Religious Education, if taken
Sociology	General entry requirements only
Spanish	6 or above in GCSE Spanish (Higher Tier)
Theatre Studies	Grade 5 of above in GCSE Drama or Theatre Studies, if studied

<sup>\*</sup>These subject specific entry requirements are in addition to our general admissions criteria (Attainment 8 score of at least 50 and GCSE passes in English at least grade 5 and in Maths at least grade 4).

All proposed A Level courses are dependent on a viable number of students opting for them. Decisions about the viability of courses and responses to viability issues lie solely with Bishop Stopford School. (These include the right to withdraw courses, reduce contact time or to teach Year 12 and Year 13 students concurrently).

Where courses are oversubscribed, the school retains the right to limit numbers.
