How does our curriculum do > Something More?

KS5 Music:

- Fostering a sense of belonging and interconnectedness with others:

 All students are encouraged to perform to each other, both in class, and school and county ensembles, in assemblies, concerts and in the local community. The Music department is a place of respect for others and we supportive to all student performances in class, whether formal assessments or spontaneous demos of work.
- Using hands-on activities, field trips and experiments to immerse students in learning and evoke wonder.

 Experience trips to local theatres for concerts eg RPO and shows, to witness the excitement and buzz of a live professional performance.

 Studies of great composers and their context to inspire and gain understanding of the 'why' music sounds like it does. Set works studies include innovations in performance practice, invention of instruments and ground breaking compositional techniques.
