## **Safe Space**

Last week marked Men's Mental Health Week, an important opportunity to bring attention to the disparity in reporting of mental health concerns between men and women. Popular comedian Romesh Ranganathan recently spoke out about his own mental health struggles, saying that 'recognising it is half the battle' (Romesh Ranganathan opens up about mental health struggle on Desert Island Discs - BBC News).

Men's Mental Health Week has been celebrated in communities, workplaces and universities up and down the country and different groups are sharing advice, friendship and space to talk. Though they contain material that some may find triggering, these resources from the charity 'Mates in Mind' seek to break the silence and stigma that can surround mental ill-health:

## **Important Information**

Over the last few months, there have been some violent incidents that have been reported in the Kettering area. In response to this, the local housing officers are working with the local police to engage with the community and offer their support.

On Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> June, there will be a Police Beat bus near Highfield Road during the afternoon. Trained professionals will be available to offer mental health and substance misuse support and police will listen to resident concerns or reports about what is happening in the area. There will also be an amnesty bin for weapons nearby. These have proved hugely successful in other areas across Northamptonshire at reducing the number of weapons – especially bladed items – on the streets.

School staff will supervise the school buses as normal and parents and students are welcome to visit the Police Beat bus if they would like to.
