RSE is delivered to all year groups within the Christian context of Bishop Stopford School. We consult with parents on our Policy to ensure we build knowledge and establish appropriate attitudes and values surrounding personal relationships, sexual development and behaviour.

RSE consists of three strands:

- the biological aspects of reproduction, taught within Science as part of the National Curriculum.
- social aspects of RSE, which are covered in programmes of Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education (PSHE), including information about HIV, Aids and other sexually transmitted infections.
- the moral aspects of RSE covered in the RE curriculum, including marriage, contraception, termination and family life.

Last year, I had the privilege of applying for the Army Officer Scholarship Scheme, a highly competitive application process available for Year 12s studying at a Sixth Form. This application lasted several months and culminated in a three day selection board at the Army Officer Selection Board in Westbury. 
