



# Safe Space


The Mental Health Support Team came into school to lead workshops for Year 11 and 13 students to support them in managing their mental health during this exam period. Alongside the work we do in school, these workshops allowed students to see that success and achievement doesn't need to be to the detriment of wellbeing. Instead, preparation, balance and routines can enable effective revision to occur, while still offering space for hobbies, rest and time with families and friends. The team discussed healthy and unhealthy habits, challenging negative thinking, and practical ways of refocusing when we feel the physical symptoms of stress.

The graphics below are some of those shared with the students which may support discussions at home, too. While some stress can create the urgency that allows us to perform well, too much can be detrimental, and identifying the early signs can help young people to manage their stress in healthy ways.

## **Alumni Corner**


#### **Our Alumni Network Keeps Growing!**


