Mental Health Awareness

The oft used phrase 'mental health matters' couldn't be truer. As a society, we are responding to political and economic challenges, global conflict and uncertainty in many areas of life. As a result, our young people are growing up in a world which can seem fraught with danger and one that, because of technology and online platforms, demands high levels of awareness and responsibility. But it is also an exciting time where innovation is rewarded and new tools like AI can make finding that difficult family member's Christmas gift just that little bit easier!

Recent assemblies delivered by the Mental Health Support Team (MHST) reinforced the message that mental health is not static. They reassured students that everyone experiences periods of low mood as well as times of joy. However, they also encouraged students to seek support if negative feelings get stronger or don't recede.

In school, we have a range of support available:


- Peer mentoring
- Staff mentoring
- 1:1 with a member of the pastoral team
- YouthWorks Counselling (1:1)
- MHST Counselling (1:1)
- Souster Youth (group intervention)
- School Nurse service

We also work with families where referrals to CAMHS are appropriate, and have strong links with YouthWorks offering support to students beyond the school day.




Mental Health Awareness (cont'd from p1)

Learning about emotional health and wellbeing takes place in our PSHE lessons and in tutor time. Students know that they can seek out help from trusted adults in school.

A new initiative – Wellbeing Wednesdays – has been launched this week for our Sixth Form students. It is shared via email and on our Instagram page with targeted strategies for older students. The first weeks is focused on self-help CBT strategies shared by MSHT.

If you have a concern about a student in this regard please do reach out to their form tutor or Head of Year and we'll work with them to provide the support they need.



Safe Space

Over the last fortnight, we will all have felt the days getting colder and darker. Students are now regularly travelling in the dark and we want to encourage them to consider how to keep themselves safe. Many wear dark coats and jackets which can be hard for cars to see.

These small changes can help students to keep safe:

- Students should consider how visible they are to cars and other traffic. Many jackets have reflectors, and small additional reflective items can be worn. Colour from a scarf, hat or gloves is invaluable.
- 2. Students cycling should have lights at the front and back of their bike. They should also carry a spare in case the battery fails. High visibility covers for helmets are also incredibly useful.
- 3. When students are listening to music or chatting on their phones on the way home, we encourage them to use only one ear bud. This allows them to be aware of their surroundings, including hearing approaching traffic, car horns or people calling to them.



Instagram Safety – Teen Accounts

Instagram is a social media app where you can post photos and videos of your life, interests and passions. It is currently very popular with young people. As with all social media apps, it does come with a level of danger.

Instagram has fairly recently created new teen accounts to reduce risk. Anyone under 16 requires parental permission to open an Instagram account.



Default settings

- For under 16s they will automatically have a teen account and will need to add a parent to change key privacy settings
- they can only be messaged by people they're friends with
- they will see less sensitive content from accounts they don't follow
- identification is required for an adult account to prevent teens lying about their age

In Teen Accounts, parents can:

- see who their child is messaging
- · see what topics their child is interested in
- · set time limits for their child on the app
- block the app for specific time periods

Limits

Instagram identifies an adult as anyone over the age of 18 with an Instagram account. It is important if a young person is trying Instagram for the first time, an adult supports with setting up and linking their account.
