Last week, we had the pleasure of hosting our annual Year 12 Conference. This packed day included sessions on study skills, post 18 options and young driver awareness. It is a vital element of our curriculum here at Bishop, ensuring that student learning stretches beyond just the classroom. As part of the day, we welcomed Live n Learn and Keith Mallard from Kier to assist in delivering sessions, alongside Mrs McNab and Mrs Styles.

We were also fortunate that Jacob Hicks in Year 13 led part of a presentation on Post 18 options, sharing his experience of successfully gaining a scholarship to complete his studies in Year 13, a subsequent scholarship for his degree followed by a place to start basic training with the Armed Forces. Live n Learn provided an informative session on A-Level study skills and time management whilst Keith delivered a thought provoking and reflective session on the risks young drivers face.

We know our Year 12 students have plenty of 'take aways' from the day. Feedback from students was strong, with over 80% saying their knowledge of how to organise their time had improved.
