

## **Safe Space**

#### **Healthy Relationships**

In the news over half term was the sentencing of 17-year-old Logan MacPhail. He stalked and then killed his exgirlfriend, Holly, who was just 15 at the time. Holly's parents have spoken openly about the change they saw in the relationship over time, moving from what they described as a 'typical teenage relationship' to one where there were significant concerns about coercion and control.

Advice for schools from experts, our local authority and national charities like the NSPCC is to speak openly and frequently about healthy relationships, encouraging young people to identify potentially harmful behaviours. In PSHE lessons, assemblies and tutor times, we talk to students about the traits of healthy and unhealthy relationships, exploring friendships as well as romantic relationships.

However, it can be challenging to spot the signs, as Holly Newton's parents described from their own tragic experience. Police data reveals that 18% of all crime recorded in England and Wales is domestic abuse. To support families, the NSPCC has published a range of resources, including a video of three parents talking together about how they have approached open dialogue with their teenaged children:

#### **Online Challenges**



Online Challenges commonly appear through social media or other online platforms. These Challenges are often created to cause alarm and are designed to seem enticing or exciting for young people, but can harm self, others or property.

#### What should you do?

# ou do?

#### Don't encourage it

Warning others about an online challenge may seem like the smart thing to do, but naming it can inadvertently direct other people towards it. Sending warnings can draw unwanted attention towards the challenge and the potential harm it can bring.

#### Have open conversations

Children and young people can encounter online challenges which may cause upset. They may also see challenges which initially seem fun but could actually cause real offline harm. Ensure that you or someone your child can trust is available to talk.

#### Report it

Stop the spread of harm by reporting the challenge online. Social media sites and other platforms direct users to report content that is harmful.


